

Program Background

The Rutland Regional Planning Commission (RRPC) is a public nonprofit subdivision of the State of Vermont, serving 27 member municipalities across the Rutland Region. The RRPC has managed a regional brownfields assessment program since the early 2000s and has received 10 Brownfields Assessment Grants from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The Former Berwick Hotel property has received over \$200,000 in assessment funding through this program, to further cleanup and redevelopment of the site.

Site Overview

Address: 27 Wales Street, 33 Wales Street, 92 Willow Street, and 43 Center Street, Rutland, VT 05701

Description: The Former Berwick Hotel site is a 0.89-acre property located at the corner of Center Street and Wales Street

in downtown Rutland City. The property was formerly home to a historic hotel, which burned down in 1973. Today, the site contains a vacant lot and a large office building. A local construction company hopes to redevelop the property into a mixed-use building containing 100 +/- hotel rooms, 26-28 market rate

apartments, 20 parking spaces, and 20 storage units.

Cleanup Objectives

- 1. Reduce Environmental Hazard Risks to Downtown Rutland
- 2. Sustainably Reuse Existing Infrastructure
- 3. Create Infill Housing and Jobs
- 4. Foster Economic Revitalization

Timeline

- 2021: Center & Wales, LLC enroll into State of Vermont Brownfields Reuse and Environmental Liability Limitation Program (BRELLA)
- 2021: Property acquisition by Center & Wales, LLC
- 2021 2024: Completion of site assessment on property
- 2024: Draft Corrective Action Plan (CAP) completed and sent for approval
